The Power of Membership

During the month of October, Wake Electric reminds members that it's National Co-op Month. And that reminder is to let our members know that now, as always, it's a good time to be a member of an electric cooperative.

Not only is Wake Electric locally owned and controlled—by you, our members—it is locally run to serve your needs.

While many North Carolina electricity consumers pay power bills to companies that answer to far-away stockholders who demand a healthy profit every quarter, local members call the shots at electric co-ops like ours. Co-ops aren't under pressure to keep rates high enough to generate big profits. Instead, co-ops try to keep your bill as low as possible while providing high-quality service. Co-ops invest money in excess of operating costs back into the business locally or return the excess (known as margins) to you in the form of capital credits.

We also invest back into the community through education and community outreach programs. We prove our passionate commitment to community through the programs we offer every year.

Annually, Wake Electric gives:

- ★ \$50,000 in Bright Ideas grants to develop exciting projects for local students.
- ★ \$22,000 in scholarships and youth programs to local students.



- ★ \$50 U.S. Savings Bonds to more than 100 local students in the "Give us an A" program.
- ★ \$20,000 in Classroom Technology Awards to help local educators buy special equipment.
- ★ Nearly \$50,000 in grants to area non-profits.

Sales Tax Holiday on Energy Star Appliances

Since 2008, the state of NC has honored a sales tax holiday for Energy Star appliances. The dates for 2010 are Friday, November 5 through Sunday, November 7, 2010.

The qualified products are:

- ★ Clothes washers.
- ★ Freezers and refrigerators.
- ★ Central air conditioners and room air conditioners.
- ★ Air-source heat pumps and geothermal heat pumps.
- ★ Ceiling fans.
- ★ Dehumidifiers.
- ★ Programmable thermostats.



NOTE: The ENERGY STAR specification for programmable thermostats was suspended on December 31, 2009. Check with retailers to determine if their existing stock of ENERGY STAR labeled programmable thermostats (manufactured prior to 12/31/09) offered for sale are still eligible for the exemption.
